

Which Lessons Do We Need?

Determining which type of lesson to take is easy! Just match your skiing and snowboarding abilities with the corresponding box below. Discover the lesson level abilities for your group.

Level 1: Green

Ski: I have never skied before and need to learn the basics from how to put my skis on to how to balance and stop.

Snowboard: I have never been snowboarding before at a ski resort and need to learn all the basics from how my snowboard works to how to balance and stop.

Level 2: Yellow

Ski: I have learned how to use a snowplow or wedge to stop and need to work on making basic wedge turns on easy terrain.

Snowboard: I have learned how to ride the chair and am can stop with out falling down and I can make turns on one edge. I am ready to learn my other edge.

Level 3: Blue

Ski: I can make basic wedge turns on easy terrain and am ready to work on controlling my speed with different size turns and am ready to learn about bringing my skis closer to parallel.

Snowboard: I can make falling leaf turns on both edges and am ready to learn how to link my edges together to make S-turns.

Level 4: Blue

Ski: I can make good wedge turns and am starting to match my skis together more often. I am ready to learn how to control my speed and my turns on a little more challenging terrain.

Snowboard: I can link my turns together on both edges on easy terrain and am ready to learn how on more challenging terrain.

Level 5: Red

Ski: I ski parallel most of the time and want to explore the mountain working on balance in different kinds of terrain.

Snowboard: I can control my speed with my turns on intermediate terrain and I want to explore new runs and different kinds of terrain.

Level 6: Black

Ski: I ski parallel all of the time and want to challenge myself with terrain like bumps, powder.

Snowboard: I can ride all the intermediate runs and am ready to learn about more technical terrain like bumps and powder and steeper runs.
